



Wide ranging practical programs encouraging young people to be the change agents in their own life, providing support so they can achieve those changes.

Program information

The Youth at Risk Alliance (YARA)

YARA provides coordinated and integrated case planning for young people aged 10-17 years with complex needs through its Complex Needs Assessment Panels (CNAP).

Youth Support Coordinators (YSC)

The YSC program features the largest YSC team in the State and provides individual support to those at risk from disengaging from education and not entering into their senior phase of learning.

The Complex Needs Assessment Panel for Youth (CNAPY) – Connecting Health Care in Communities (CHIC)

The CNAPY provides integrated and coordinated services for children aged 0-10 years (and their families) who have multiple and complex needs.

Expanded Horizons Program (EHP)

The EHP is a National Suicide Prevention Program that supports young people who are refugees, lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgendered and who are at increased risk of self-harm or suicide.

Community Care Services

Community Care Services offer professional, caring support for older people living within the community who need assistance. A wide range of support is provided including personal care, nursing support, shopping, light housework and Allied Health Therapy.

Walk in My Shoes

The Walk in My Shoes program is a bullying education program developed in partnership with young people. The program comprises of workshops delivered to students, teachers and any other relevant services and provides information about the impact of bullying. It has been successfully trialled and implemented at a number of schools and is endorsed by Griffith University.





Restart

The Restart program provides an alternative learning program for young people aged 15-17 years who have disengaged from mainstream education.

Social Connections Project

This project has been developed to help raise awareness of the importance social support and connections have in protecting and promoting good health. The project also assists with people accessing resources when they are unwell.
